About Us:	<p>The Health System in Aotearoa is entering a period of transformation as we implement the Pae Ora/Healthy Futures vision of a reformed system where people live longer in good health, have improved quality of life, and there is equity between all groups.</p> <p>We want to build a healthcare system that works collectively and cohesively around a shared set of values and a culture that enables everyone to bring their best to work and feel proud when they go home to their whānau, friends and community. In order to guide the culture, values, and behaviour expected of the health sector, Health New Zealand Te Mauri o Rongo provides common values, principles, and behaviours through four Pou, to guide health entities and their workers, enabling a cultural transformation of the health sector. Te Mauri o Rongo fundamentally upholds a key system shift of the New Zealand health reforms to reinforce and embrace Te Tiriti and our obligations to it.</p> <p>The pou are a platform and a foundation to empower a culture transformation, every person is guided to align themselves to the pou and enact the values and behaviours that the pou represent. Key performance objectives:

Due to rostering and other operational requirements, not all senior technicians will be required to routinely perform every task contained within this position description.

Task:

The Pharmacy Technician Specialist (Production) is responsible for maintaining specialist level knowledge and practice of all areas within the Production Unit and may be required to undertake Pharmacy Accuracy Checking Technician (PACT) tasks.

Expected results:

- Specialist knowledge is applied to everyday practice and shared with other staff in relation to pharmaceutical compounding within the scope of a pharmacy technician, particularly related to technical, logistics, compliance, and funding aspects, from handling raw materials to finished products, products provided through third party compounders, and equipment used in the process, following the good manufacturing practice (GMP) guidelines, PICS, Pharmacy standards, SOPs and applicable legislation.
- Assistance provided by undertaking PACT tasks within the Production Unit and dispensary/repacking.
- ePharmacy and Mosaiq Super-User capabilities are developed and maintained, including training others in the use of the software, and troubleshooting issues. This is applicable to other software as it becomes available within the Production Unit.
- Patients receive their medicine in a timely manner to meet scheduled administration appointments.
- Medicines supplied according to PHARMAC funding criteria with escalation to a pharmacist to provide advice to prescribers on ways to obtain funding where not provided for under the Hospital Medicines List or Pharmaceutical Schedule.
- Accurate and appropriate documentation and computer records maintained, including to ensure timely purchasing of patient medicines, and appropriate reimbursement from Sector Services/PHARMAC.
- Any issues, concerns or emerging risks are escalated to the Pharmacist Supervisor (Production), and near miss/good catch logs and incident reports are completed.
- Cytotoxic and other waste is disposed of according to guidelines.

Task:

The Pharmacy Technician Specialist (Production) will assist in the orientation, training, and development of staff, according to scope, in the Production Unit

Expected results:

- All staff rostered to production services, including new staff, pharmacists, pharmacy students/trainees, and intern pharmacists are orientated and trained in the production unit according to applicable area orientation, training manuals and scope. Note: Pharmacist specific training needs are overseen by the Pharmacist Supervisor (Production).
- Any issues or concerns with training or orientation are escalated to the Pharmacist Supervisor (Production) immediately.
- Staff training needs are identified and communicated to the Pharmacist Supervisor (Production) and Senior Pharmacy Technician (Production).
- Assistance in development and feedback on new programmes or reviews is provided through application of specialist knowledge to meet required timelines.
- Ensure training package, validation and revalidation documentation is completed for each staff member in a timely manner.

Task:

The Pharmacy Technician Specialist (Production) is responsible for actively contributing to the quality initiatives, goal setting and development/review of SOPs in the Production Unit and the wider pharmacy.

Expected results:

- Quality improvement initiatives are undertaken, to enable an innovative, forward-thinking service, considering new ways of working which benefit the patient, other health professionals and are financially sustainable
- All quality activities and documentation are consistent with other Waitaha Canterbury Pharmacy sites to maintain standardisation across Waitaha Canterbury Pharmacy services
- Active participation in developing goals, objectives, and performance metrics for the Production Unit which align with the department and Health New Zealand targets, as led by the Pharmacist Supervisor (Production)
- Documentation, pharmacy practice and SOPs are in keeping with all applicable legislation, New Zealand Pharmacy Standards and accepted good evidence-based practice, and any deviation is addressed in a timely manner.
- Applicable activities and audits specified in the department's quality plan are actioned, further developed, and reviewed.

Task:

The Pharmacy Technician Specialist (Production) is responsible for ensuring stock control and maintenance of accurate stock records including returned medications in the Production Unit, for communicating pharmaceutical requirements to staff responsible for inventory and will respond promptly to medication safety and stock issues as identified by the Medication Safety pharmacist.

Expected results:

- Complete, accurate and timely stock records are maintained
- Unusual requirements, obsolete or short dated stock are identified and monitored, and the Purchasing Officer or other delegated person is informed
- Short-dated stock is reallocated before the expiry where possible
- Expired stock is kept to a minimum and reported as directed

Task:

The Pharmacy Technician Specialist (Production) will assist as requested with clinical trial compounding set up, coordination and documentation and for assisting Clinical Pharmacists in the non-clinical components of set up, co-ordination and logistics of compassionate and access programme medicines relevant to the Production Unit.

Expected results:

- Accurate and appropriate SOPS, documentation and computer records maintained
- Stock control activities are carried out in a timely manner
- Appropriate paperwork and SOPs are completed for compassionate and access programme medicines
- Communication with clinical staff, trial organisers and appropriate pharmacy staff is clear and timely

Task:

The Pharmacy Technician Specialist (Production) is responsible for dispensing and supplying inpatient and outpatient medication and attending to administrative tasks associated with the dispensing, repacking, manufacturing, and distribution of medicines, including controlled drugs; and for dealing with non-clinical enquiries.

Expected results:

- Pharmacy practices are efficient and in keeping with all applicable legislation, New Zealand Pharmacy Standards, SOPs and accepted good practice.
- Day-to-day dispensing and distribution activities occur in a timely manner as per SOPs which includes but is not limited to leave medications, blister packing, ward technician visits, medication returns and destruction, 6 monthly template updates, ward imprests, controlled drug orders.
- Clients of the service receive effective pharmaceutical services in a timely and prioritised fashion.
- Accurate and appropriate documentation and computer records are maintained.
- Non-clinical enquiries are answered in an accurate and timely manner, with all clinical enquiries being referred to a pharmacist.
- Participation in the late-night dispensary roster each week.

Task:

The Pharmacy Technician Specialist (Production) will undertake any other duties consistent with the above position description which are operationally necessary and are requested by the Pharmacist Supervisor (Production), Technician Supervisor, Service Manager, Pharmacy or Chief Pharmacist, Pharmacy.

Expected results:

- All duties undertaken in the best interest of Health NZ Canterbury are carried out in a competent and efficient manner.

HEALTH & SAFETY:

- Observe all Health NZ Canterbury safe work procedures and instructions

- Be a trained PACT, or willing to train as a PACT
- Must have at least three year's hospital pharmacy experience
- Must be client focused and committed to providing a high quality service.
- Must have good written and oral communication skills
- Must have the ability to supervise and train staff.
- Must be committed to continuing education
- Be in good physical health and possess normal manual dexterity.

Desirable

- Have previous experience in a specialist, senior or supervisory level role
- Have previous experience in a Production unit, cytotoxic, sterile, and non-sterile compounding
